History of Rowing in the Capital District and BHRA

The Capital District used to be a mecca for rowing. Colleges such as Union, Williams, Yale, and Harvard, among many others, would engage in enormous races on Saratoga Lake. You probably don't remember as this occurred prior to 1875!

At that time, most rowing shells seated six people and did not have sliding seats. Rowers realized that the shells could go faster if they used their legs. This was facilitated by wearing special pants and greasing their bottoms so as to slide on a board. Upon the rapid conclusion that if one puts wheels on a special seat, not only will the boat go faster, but the problem of getting grease on the seats of the horse drawn college crew bus would be resolved. Rumor has it that after an unnamed college president's wife messed up her white dress sitting where a "rower" had been, initiated the challenge to the engineering students to solve this messy problem. The rest is history.

Rowing, in general, fell into bad times. It became a professional sport and the object of gambling. The sport began to recover by the 1930s, but was found mainly at Ivy League and elite prep schools of the Northeast. It wasn't until 1973, that rowing was resurrected in this area by Ned Bigelow of Aqueduct Rowing Club. By 1984, Aqueduct had outgrown their small boathouse and Union College had just restarted their rowing program after a brief 100 year rest! Aqueduct built a larger boathouse in 1985 to house these two programs. Two years later, Niskayuna started a youth program and eventually built an additional bay onto the Aqueduct Boathouse. Since then, Skidmore, SUNY at Albany, Rensselaer Polytechnic institute, Saratoga Springs Rowing Club; not to be confused with the Saratoga Spring Rowing Association, Schenectady County Community College, and the Albany Rowing Center all started adult and collegiate programs. Youth programs expanded to include Niskayuna, Shenendehowa, Emma Willard, Albany, Shaker, Saratoga (SSRA), Columbia, Burnt Hills, Scotia-Glenville, Schenectady, Brown School, Guilderland, and Queensbury.

In the fall of 1993, 14 students from Burnt Hills including one from South Colonie and one from Mohonasen (Katy Frank '97) rowed in a club called the ECAC (Erie Canal

Athletic Club) under the supervision of Union College. The participation quickly grew to 30 students the following spring, and prompted them to form their own club, the Burnt Hills Rowing Association (BHRA).

BHRA became incorporated in August of 1994, and has grown to a four season program that includes programs for youth and adult rowing.

BHRA has come a long way since then; from borrowed and used fiberglass boats with wooden gunnels to purchasing our own brand new carbon fiber state of the art racing shells, construction of the long awaited new boathouse on Maritime Drive in 1999, and the docks have grown to over 200 feet to accommodate three eights at one time. In the fall of 2007, Burnt Hills Rowing dedicated a beautiful addition to our boathouse, the Patrick C. Breslin Strength Training Facility – a year round, 4,500 square foot heated gym facility specifically designed for training rowers by Ed McNeely M. Sc. (The Canadian Olympic Rowing Teams Strength and Conditioning coach.)

BHRA hosts the annual Mohawk Fall Classic Regatta (formerly the Spartan Sweepstake Race) each fall and has since established a modified program which introduces middle school students to sculling prior to sweep rowing in high school.

Much credit goes to the families and community that support the many fundraisers the student-athletes conduct to purchase their equipment. And we would be amiss if we didn't acknowledge the fine coaches who spend far more hours than most are aware, working with the rowers to help them achieve their goals. Many of our rowers are realizing their dreams at college due to their connection to the rowing community.

The Making of a Boathouse

What a beautiful boathouse we have!!!! Three wide bays with concrete floors including changing rooms, coaches offices, workbenches, and with room to share a bay with Shenendehowa Crew. A second floor for storage of unused shells and boat repairs with a balcony where you can even see up to the GE logo in downtown Schenectady; all totaling 12,000 square feet. Additionally, a 4,500 square foot heated gym specifically designed for rower's indoor training. Included are two more changing rooms, with bathrooms that include flush toilets and hot and cold running water - a rarity and often not found in boathouses.

Outside, we have a beautiful dedication patio inlaid with bricks depicting eights rowing to the river and inscribed with past donors to the boathouse construction. There is a covered boat rack for the storage of fours and quads, and a large pavilion for events and gatherings. Not to be outdone, over 200 feet of low profile dock facilitates the launching of multiple rowing shells and the storage of coach launches. All this being on one of the finest and usually calm sections of the Mohawk River. The best testament of how nice our facilities are is when parents and rowers come back after college visits and complain that the college boathouses were not nearly as nice as BHRA. We will take the hit!

But it wasn't always like this. It is a long story how we got to where we are, but it is important for current rowers and their families to understand our history in this regard and have an appreciation for what we have. BHRA started in 1993, renting four indoor racks at the Aqueduct Rowing Club boathouse in the bay that Union College had just vacated. It did not accommodate all our equipment, the place was very crowded, parking almost non-existent, and access to the area adjacent to the Rexford Bridge traffic light was challenging during rush hour and crew pickup. Additionally, we lost many days of on-water training due to the wind and whitecaps out on the river. After a couple of years, we relocated to the far upstream corner of the Mohawk Valley Marine thanks to the generosity of owner Bob Esperti. Initially, all our equipment was stored outside and we launched our shells walking on picnic tables over the bank to get into the river.

Soon enough, we had 80 feet of new dock, constructed a mini boathouse which is now our gas shed, and the National Guard folks at Stratton donated a large army tent which became our change room. It was a cozy arrangement, but our crew deserved better.

In parallel with the move to the marina in the 1997 timeframe, the quest for a permanent boathouse became more demanding. I received a generous offer from Skip Katz to build a boathouse on his property off White's Beach Road on the western shore of Ballston Lake. This proved problematic for a number of reasons. Two of those being that the Ballston Lake Residents Association were opposed and that we would have to routinely drive over an unguarded railroad crossing to enter the Katz driveway. This would have been a dangerous situation. But the final straw was that the boathouse would have to be set back and not visible to the lake due to about a 200 foot wide wetland. Docks would have been an issue and the boathouse would only have been one bay. My efforts with the DEC were basically a show stopper and John Gay, owner of CT Male Engineering, told me that I would probably win, but it would take four or five years and we did not have that much time. I closed the books on this one and thanked Skip Katz for his offer.

I then met with Glenville Town official Kevin Corcoran who advised meeting with Stan Kivort. Stan Kivort was a person who loved helping out kids and also owned all the land that the marina and the Maritime Center are located. I met with Stan for breakfast at the Sky Port Diner on Freemans Bridge Road. It turns out that Stan was trying to get the Capital Region Maritime Center (CRMC) a permanent home - a school that would be for "at risk" youth to learn maritime studies through BOCES while in high school. It was a dream of his and I thought I could help with the organization. Timing was perfect. They needed organizational help and I needed a place for a boathouse. CRMC was quickly incorporated, 501(c)(3) tax exempt, elected a board, bylaws, etc. Late in 1997, CRMC put in a bid for a HUD Canal Corridor Initiative Project through Schenectady County and won it to the tune of \$940,000. The money was to allow for the acquisition of land and the construction of the Maritime Center. The major challenge was to find the land on which to build the center. That was no easy task as the facility had to be located on the river in the Town of Glenville. Very little real estate exists that can be developed which is out of the flood plain. Stan Kivort said he would donate 6 acres at our current location, but local residents were concerned with increased traffic. Stan then donated another 5 acres of land to allow for the construction of the road from the Center out to Alplaus Avenue. The cost of constructing a 3000 foot road and building the maritime center exceeded the money available from HUD. With no other options available, in late December, 1997, the CRMC

board had concluded that the project could not proceed. That meant that the prospects of having a boathouse next door would not happen. I had the idea that we could put in a gravel road vice paved for \$110,000 and thus would have enough money to also build the Maritime Center! The board agreed and designed for the building preceded by Smith Architects of Burnt Hills (now Re4orm Architects of Schenectady). BHRA signed a Memorandum of Agreement with CRMC to permit us to build the boathouse next door. I did the conceptual design for the new boathouse and proceeded to start a fundraising campaign to support construction. Final design for the boathouse was done by Larry Rogers, owner of Delaware Engineering, whose son rowed with BHRA. In the fall of 1998, the stars in heaven lined up for both CRMC and BHRA and a wonderful groundbreaking took place which included representatives from BHRA, other rowing clubs, CRMC, Town of Glenville, County of Schenectady, BOCES, and various political representatives. Bast Hatfield was hired by CRMC to clear the land and build their building and we had Stan Symzack, master house builder and grandfather of two of our rowers, to oversee the boathouse construction. We hired Al Shadow of Charlton to install the slab which with the help of parents and rowers, we almost got completed two days before Christmas, 1998, when the temperature dropped about 50 degrees overnight! In March, 1999, we finished the slab by the last day of the month when the temperature hit an astonishing 90 degrees! Al Shadow also did all the site grading. By this time, we had saved about \$50,000 towards the construction and took out a mortgage at First National Bank of Scotia for another \$50,000. The stick framing, second floor, all the siding, electrical, interior outfitting, change rooms, painting, etc. was done by parents and rowers working every weekend 10 to 12 hours a day. A contractor was hired to place the roof trusses and Vindetti Roofing volunteered to install the metal roof. At the beginning of the fall season in 1999, we had our grand opening and moved all our equipment from the marina field. We gladly and thankfully returned the army tent to the National Guard base and the temporary boathouse became our gas shed! Moving into the boathouse was a glorious day, but we had more adventures ahead of us. Over the next couple of years, we bought additional sections of dock and installed what turned out to be a marginal anchoring system. The 3000 foot gravel road became a dust bowl each afternoon. A couple of years down the road, no pun intended, Senator Farley's office made arrangements to pave the road and then immediately turn it over to the Town of Glenville as a town road. By this time, CRMC was hosting the BOCES maritime program to some 24 school districts. Enrollment was around 20 to 23 students and a staff of 12. BHRA's rower population was running about 100 and we launched Scotia

Glenville Crew and Guilderland Crew. Shenendehowa was settled in with their program in the third bay.

In the fall of 2006, the previous varsity boys co-captain, Patrick Breslin, unexpectedly passed away during the beginning of his second year of college. The Breslin Family asked what they could do in his memory for the rowing club as it had meant so much to their son. The coaches and rowers unanimously said they would like to have a nice winter training facility. Up to this point, winter and spring land training was done at various elementary school locations and the basement of town hall using makeshift weights. I laid out a conceptual design for the gym and erg room. The Breslin Family and Turner Construction donated time, labor, and other resources to construct what you see there today. This included all the equipment and a bonafide youth and masters training program. As part of the construction, the dedication patio was upgraded and moved to its current location and the fours shed was built.

Soon after, rower Eric Burgoyne, who was looking for an Eagle Scout project, led the effort to construct the pavilion adjacent to the boathouse and recently rower Sean Jackson installed electrical power as part of his Eagle Scout project.

In September, 2011, as a result of tropical storms Irene and Lee, tragedy struck as the river rose 15 feet and a high flow rate ensued. The anchoring system for the docks failed and caused the docks to buckle and become overstressed. We did not lose any of the docks fortunately, but major work was required to temporarily re-anchor them. Paul Rouis, partner for Ryan-Biggs Engineering Firm, whose son rowed with BHRA, took the lead to stabilize the river bank, ordered new dock sections from Sullivan Floation, which included significantly upgrading the anchoring system. Considering the damage from this storm to the Erie Barge Canal and their locks and dams, BHRA was very lucky we didn't completely lose the dock.

This is a long story, but important for all of us to appreciate as there is no one in the club these days except for Matt Palitsch, one of our Directors who helped build the boathouse, and myself that were around in those early days. The journey is not over. As our club continues to grow and mature, people will come and go, facilities will need upgrading, new equipment will need to be purchased, and programs modified to stay current. BHRA is a wonderful organization dedicated to the betterment of our youth. Your continued volunteer and financial support will keep this program vibrant

History of the Mohawk Fall Classic Regatta

The inaugural Mohawk Fall Classic Regatta, formerly the Spartan Sweepstakes Regatta, was held for the first time on October 14th, 2001. At that time, Aqueduct Rowing Club, hosts of the Head of the Mohawk Regatta, decided to no longer offer junior events in order to focus on Masters and Collegiate rowing. BHRA filled that void by hosting a “juniors only” regatta on the Sunday after the Head of the Mohawk.

The original regatta course started at the BHRA Boathouse, headed upstream around the Isle of the Cayugas (near the Glen Sanders Mansion) and returned to finish in front of the boathouse. The race was a grueling 12,000 meters long. To put that distance in perspective, the typical distance for a Head race is between 3,000 and 5,000 meters.

In 2009 the course was shortened to a more standard distance of 3,700 meters. In addition to the course change, the number of entries doubled from 44 in 2008 (what was the typical size of the regatta up until that point) to 88 in 2009.

As the regatta grew, so did the need for more space for competing teams. In 2013, the regatta site moved to Jumpin' Jack's Drive-In, where BHRA has been able to offer room for more teams and greater community involvement.

The name was changed in 2016 to the Mohawk Fall Classic Regatta and the 2017 regatta was the largest to date, with nearly 200 boats racing!

The Fleet

BHRA has amassed a very impressive fleet of fine racing shells over the past 25 plus years. In the early years of the club, the club obtained most of its boats secondhand from Union College. Boats like the *Atalanta*, *Peter B. Schwab '93*, and *Roger H. Hull*, which were acquired in the late 1990s, are still pressed into service by the club today.

Below is a short list of just some of the boats that have been purchased by BHRA and named for important individuals within our organization.

The first “new” boat purchased by the club was a slightly used 1990 Vespoli Challenger Eight. It was the first boat that the club was able to dedicate, and aptly so she was christened the *Harry J Darling*. Harry is the father of Burnt Hills rowers’ Chad Darling ‘97, Wesley Darling ‘00, and Jared Darling ‘02. Mr. Darling was instrumental in getting the team founded, organized and the boathouse built. He served as the Association's first president and held that position for seven years from 1994 to 2000. Harry continues to be on the Board of Directors, and along with his wife Lea, have been staunch supporters of the program since its inception. Harry can still be found messing about in boats on the Mohawk in his single or with Lea in their double.

Terry Bodenstab was a Vespoli Millennium Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2001 and it was one of the first new boats obtained by BHRA. Terry is the father of BH rowers’ Ehren Bodenstab ‘00 and Rachel Bodenstab ‘01. Mr. Bodenstab served as a member of the Board of Directors from 1999 to 2016. In 2013, the *Terry Bodenstab* was sold to the Baltimore Rowing Club’s At Risk Youth Program.

James McDermott is a Vespoli M2 Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2002. Mr. McDermott was the grandfather of BH rowers’ Brett Demler ‘98, Evan Demler ‘00, and Ryan Demler ‘02. Mr. McDermott passed away on February 17, 2001 at George Washington University Hospital in Washington, DC at the age of 82. Mr. McDermott was born January 4, 1919 in Dobbs Ferry, NY. He proudly served in World War II in the 2nd Chemical Mortar Battalion. Mr. McDermott was president of Mount Hope Cemetery for over 45 years.

Darling Lea is a Vespoli Racer Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2003. Lea is the mother of BH rowers’ Chad Darling ‘97, Wesley Darling ‘00, and Jared Darling ‘02.

She is also the wife of the first Association's President, Harry Darling. The Darlings have been staunch supporters of the program since its inception.

Stan's Kids is a Dirigo ZXE four. It was purchased new from Dirigo in 2003. Mr. Kivort passed away on January 13, 2013 after a long illness. Mr. Kivort was president of Kivort Steel, Inc. from 1965-1998 when he was pleased to turn the presidency of the company over to his son Robert. Long active in his community, he was a driving force in the development of the Capital Region Maritime Center, a school for at-risk youths, and the BHRA boathouse on property he donated in Alplaus.

Salvatore Esperti is a Vespoli Racer Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2004. Mr. Esperti was the grandfather of BH rowers' P.J. Esperti '06, Jacqueline Esperti '08, Morgan Esperti '12. Mr. Esperti passed away on March 28, 2016. Sal was born on May 30, 1929 in Troy, NY. He was the son of the late Pasquale and Josephine Esperti. A graduate of Scotia-Glenville High School, Sal worked at Randall Boat Co. and Scotia Marine until 1986. He then co-founded Mohawk Valley Marine in Alplaus.

Spirit of Henry C Turner is a Vespoli Ultralite II Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2007 with funds donated by Turner Construction. Turner Construction Company is an American construction company. It is one of the largest construction management companies in the United States of America. Henry Chandlee Turner (b. 1871) founded Turner Construction Company in 1902. Mark Breslin is the vice president and general manager of Turner's New York North offices, including Albany, Syracuse and Buffalo. Mark is the father of Patrick Calvin Breslin '05. Patrick was a member of the club for six years and the captain in his senior year. He went on to attend St. Lawrence University and had been the recipient of the Bradley R. Evers Outstanding First Year Student Award in his freshman year. Patrick passed away unexpectedly on September 18, 2006 while away at university.

Raghad! is a Vespoli Ultralite II Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2007 with funds donated by Turner Construction. Raghad Marie Schroeder was the mother of Burnt Hills rowers' Matthew Schroeder '03, Amanda Schroeder '06, and Kate Schroeder '08. Raghad passed away on August 28, 2014, at the age of 55. Born in Damascus, Syria, she came to the United States at the age of 10. She attended SUNY Buffalo and graduated with her degree in occupational therapy. She has since specialized in treating infants and children with feeding and sensory integration disorders.

Superintendent Schultz is Swift Pair / Double. It was purchased new from Swift in 2007. James L. Schultz was the Superintendent of Schools for Burnt Hills – Ballston Lake School District, retiring in 2012. Schultz began his life's work in that building in 1971, right out of college, as a high school English and Latin teacher. He himself graduated from the school as a member of the BH-BL Class of 1967.

Matthew J Palitsch is Swift Pair / Double. It was purchased new from Swift in 2007. Matt is the father of Burnt Hills rowers' Brian Palitsch '02, and Jeffrey Palitsch '04. In addition, Matt was second president of the Association from 2001 to 2003. He continues to be on the Board of Directors and is an active Masters rower.

Christopher R. Goody is a Vespoli Ultralite II Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2011. Chris was only 12 when he died unexpectedly. The Goody's older son, Bryan, was a member of BHRA for over five years and was team captain his senior year. Brian continued on to row for Syracuse University and Vesper Boat Club in Philadelphia.

Chrisgo5 is a Vespoli Ultralite II Eight. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2011. Chrisgo5 was the AOL screen name of Christopher Goody.

MoHo is a Vespoli Matrix2 Single. It was purchased new from Vespoli in 2011. Michael Mahoney was the father of Burnt Hills rowers' Jeffrey Mahoney '00 and Daniel Mahoney '05. Mr. Mahoney passed away June 26, 2010. Mike lived his entire life in upstate N.Y. He was born on April 11, 1952 in Glens Falls, N.Y. He received both his bachelor's degree in economics and his master's degree in accounting from the State University of New York in Oneonta and Albany. For 31 years Mike worked in the tax department at KPMG. In 1987, Mike became a partner. He retired as a federal tax partner in 2009. In addition, he was the tax professional practice partner for the Albany/Upstate New York business unit.

Clear and Present Danger is a 2010 Fluidesign Quad. Dedicated in 2018, the naming was given by the Rouis family (actually selected by Tyler Rouis '17 and his 3 boatmates who were a "clear and present danger" to take down any crew on any body of water). Paul Rouis was the fourth President of BHRA. The hull was initially leased and then purchased from the manufacturer in 2014. It was the first quad purchased in many years as middle school rowing had gravitated to coxed quads and at this point Freshman racing in particular was focusing on this boat class.

Wonder Twins is a Swift Double / Pair. Purchased new in 2015 from Swift and dedicated in 2018. The name was selected by the Kelley family (Kathy was long time VP and fifth President of BHRA) who had twin daughters rowing on the team at a time when there were three sets of twins (Kelley, Batzinger, Veresko), on the team concurrently that regularly raced doubles together.

S.S. Wonder Woman is a 2013 Wintech International Quad purchased gently used from Wintech in 2018 to be used by both the Junior and Masters programs. This boat was dedicated in honor of Coach Sarah Stomieroski who coached both the Junior and Masters programs. The name is a play on Sarah's initials and her favorite superhero. Sarah coached all levels 2010-2018.

Flacke Attack is a Swift Coxed Quad / Four purchased new in 2012 from Swift for the modified /middle school rowing program. The name was chosen well before its dedication in 2018 to honor the Flacke Family, for Martha Flacke the second President of BHRA, holding the position from 2003 to 2011, as well as Masters rower and Mom to James Flacke '08 and Ian Flacke '12. The Flacke family has dedicated countless hours and heart to BHRA over the years as athletes, Coaches, volunteers, and board members.

Mohawk Monster is Swift Coxed Quad / Four purchased new in 2012 from Swift for the modified / middle school rowing program. The name was chosen by the Middle School athletes in 2018 when it was dedicated.

The Boys in the Boat is a 2006 Vespoli Ultralite II Eight purchased by the BHRA Masters in 2015. This boat was lovingly nicknamed "The White Whale" before it's official naming in 2018, per the color of the hull as well as the size, an extra large able to withstand an average crew size up to 225 pounds.

The Spud '02 is a 2021 Wintech International Quad purchased new in 2021 from Wintech. Spud was the nickname of Judson Rudgers '02 who rowed with BHRA from 1999 to 2002. In 2001, he was a member of the New York State Champion Men's Junior Eight. His younger sister, Bridget Rudgers '11, credits Judson with getting her involved in rowing. In addition to rowing, Judson was inducted into the Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake High School Athletic Hall of Fame and nominated for All-American honors as a member of a State record-breaking swim relay team. Judson was a National Merit Scholar and a 2009 graduate of Cornell University. He passed away at his home on June 13, 2021. In his memory, a scholarship for young disadvantaged rowers was

established. In 2024, *The Spud '02* carried the boy's varsity quad to BHRA's first national championship.

Aimee M. McDonald is a 2020 Wintech International Coxed Quad purchased new in 2021 from Wintech. Aimee was the mother of Emily McDonald '22. She was a BHRA volunteer and cheerleader on the sidelines at regattas, as well as the Vice President of Volunteers from 2018 to 2019. Aimee passed away on September 15, 2020 after a courageous battle with cancer. She was a graduate of Sachem High School, Class of 1990 and received her LPN from Nassau County Vocational Education and Extension Board. Aimee spent most of her life on Long Island, living in Manorville and working with Quest Diagnostics as a Territory Manager for several years. In 2009, Aimee and her family moved to Charlton, NY where she worked at BH-BL Schools in food services and as a much-loved Teacher's Assistant. Aimee was well known in her community and loved to be involved. She had a passion for the arts, one that she shared by making costumes and doing makeup for the O'Rourke Middle School Drama Club and acting in productions for Burnt Hills Theater for Children.

Dan Anderson is a 2013 King Lightweight Eight purchased used in 2023 from Wintech.

Donica Anderson '01 is a 2021 Wintech International Quad / Straight Four purchased used in 2023 from Wintech.

Fall and Rise

By 2022 scholastic rowing had seen a sharp decline in the Capital District. At its zenith in the mid-2000s, the Section II Championships hosted teams from Albany, Bethlehem, Burnt Hills, Emma Willard, Guilderland, Mohawk Home School, Niskayuna, Queensbury, Saratoga, Schenectady, Scotia-Glenville, Shaker, and Shenendehowa. Each of these teams boasted rosters of more than thirty athletes. In 2016, the last year Section II Championships were held, there were only eight teams; half of which had more than 30 athletes. By this time, several teams had folded, and in 2009 declining numbers forced Scotia-Glenville and Schenectady to combine to form SGS Rowing. Eventually SGS merged with Shenendehowa in 2014. In the summer of 2022, decreasing enrolment at both BHRA and Shenendehowa led to the clubs collaborating for the summer and fall seasons.

There were several contributing factors for the decline in scholastic rowing. Two key factors were the rise in youth sports specialization and the Financial Crisis of 2007-2009. For years many rowers were spring only, while participating in other fall and winter varsity sports. As sports like lacrosse became increasingly popular, and their subsequent year round club offerings, more and more athletes stayed in the sport they started doing before they started middle school.

The Financial Crisis of 2007-2009 was the most serious financial crisis since the Great Depression (1929). Predatory lending targeting low-income homebuyers, excessive risk-taking by global financial institutions, and the bursting of the United States housing bubble culminated in a "perfect storm." Mortgage-backed securities (MBS) tied to American real estate, as well as a vast web of derivatives linked to those MBS, collapsed in value. Financial institutions worldwide suffered severe damage, reaching a climax with the bankruptcy of Lehman Brothers on September 15, 2008, and a subsequent international banking crisis.

This caused New York State to cut funding to Capital Region BOCES in 2018, which established a maritime academy for troubled middle-school students at the Capital District Maritime Center (CDMC) . In 2010, BOCES decided to dramatically alter the program and move it to Draper Middle School in Rotterdam. Without a tenant to lease the center for \$8,000 a month, the center's board has struggled to repay \$390,000 still owed on a HUD loan. The CDMC found a new tenant in late 2012. Saratoga Academy for the Arts and Science briefly operated a middle school in the building; however, that

was short-lived. By May 2012 the building and land upon which it stands, including the land the Boathouse is on, were up for sale.

That year the CDMC was purchased by Karen Dake, of the Stewarts family Dake. She moved her pediatric physical therapy business, MINOR Improvements, from Saratoga to the CDMC.

In addition to the financial troubles caused by the crisis, Michael Meier '02, who had been the head coach since 2002, left the program in 2016. With the perfect storm of youth sports specialization, financial troubles, and Mike's departure, enrollment in the club began to decline. By the fall of 2019, the club roster was at its lowest number since 1994. One week into the spring 2020 season, social distancing and quarantine protocols canceled the scholastic rowing season due to COVID-19 pandemic. Early on during the pandemic, it was not fully known if rowing would ever return to BHRA. That summer BHRA hired Andy Sayles '08 as the Head Coach and Program Director. Andy had rowed for BHRA, and been a member of the 2005 Men's Freshman Four State Championship boat and the 2008 Men's Senior Eight Championship boat. After graduating, Andy rowed at Marist College. Post college he continued his rowing career by coaching at several high profile programs, such as Marist College, Hudson River Rowing, Albany Rowing Center, Boston College, Riverside Boat Club, and Community Rowing Inc. Needless to say, Andy brought an abundance of rowing knowledge and enthusiasm back to BHRA.

In February 2022, BHRA returned to Camp Bob Cooper for the winter training trip after a long absence. Shen crew had been going to Camp Bob during February break in past years, and BHRA shared the trailer to South Carolina. Many Northeast teams opt to do a February trip versus an April spring break, as the Mohawk is now well thawed and rowable much earlier in the spring. On the drive home from the trip, Coach Andy Sayles and the Shen staff began to talk about having the two teams work together during "club seasons" (summer, fall, and winter), as staffing and roster sizes were much smaller than they were pre-pandemic. This seed of an idea blossomed in August 2022 when it was decided the BHRA and Shen would collaborate on a club offering during the summer, fall and winter months. This new club, Burnt Hills-Shen (BHS) would double the roster, provide a better coach to athlete ratio, and hope to achieve some economies of scale when it came to finances. By working together, BHRA and Shen were able to race three junior girls eights and four junior boys eights competitively in the first season. The Mohawk River teams had largely moved to sculling, mainly due to roster size, in the prior eight years. This collaboration allowed

both programs to compete in eights at a higher level. The highlight of the first fall was the BHS girls eight finishing in the top half of the Head of the Charles and getting an automatic bid for the next year.

With BHRA and Shen working together, the Patrick C. Breslin indoor training center was able to be utilized to its full potential over the winter. Instead of fifteen to twenty athletes working out, the space was home to over sixty rowers and a dozen new middle schoolers learning how to properly strength train. For Shen crew, this allowed them to take part in a dedicated training space for rowing, as opposed to moving their twenty ergs to a local commercial gym and paying thousands of dollars to said gym. The results of the winter training were palpable the following spring, as both organizations won State Championships in 2023, along with many medals in additional boat classes.
